

Our 43^{r d} Annual Reunion will be held at the **Red Lion Hotel-Janzten Beach**, conveniently located off I-5, just 10 minutes north of downtown Portland and 15 minutes from the Portland International Airport. Special rates have been negotiated for our group and room reservations can now be made by phone or online through our custom site. Group rates are:

Standard Rooms at \$149 (overlooks the parking area) **Premium Rooms** at \$164 (overlooks the river, pool, & courts)

These rates will also be offered for nights before and after our official reunion period based on availability. Discounted rates on upgraded rooms (i.e. Junior Suites) may be also available but are not subject to our contract. Applying AAA, Senior, Military discounts *may* possibly get you a better rate.

All rooms are identical and include balconies, small refrigerators, microwaves, internet, complimentary business center use, and free parking. Hotel shuttle service to the MAX rail station and other locations within a 4 mile radius will be provided free of charge.

Reservations can be modified or cancelled up to 24 hours before your first night stay. A 15.3% Occupancy Tax will be added to your room bill.

Nightly rates available only for as long as group rooms are available. Cutoff Date for group rate is April 25th, 2017

Evergreen Air & Space Museum – Friday, May 18th

The Evergreen Aviation & Space Museum is an aviation museum which displays a number of military and civilian aircraft and spacecraft, most notably, the Hughes H-4 Hercules "Spruce Goose"

The bus ride to and from the museum will take approximately 1½ hours aboard 56-passenger luxury busses with restroom facilities. Busses will depart the hotel at 2:30PM and will arrive back at approximately 11PM. Food & beverages are allowed on the busses, but are strictly forbidden from entering the museum.

Important: We have only chartered (3) busses for a maximum capacity of 165 and will be initially limiting our ticket sales to that total. If exceeded we will try to find a solution, but nothing is guaranteed.

Unfortunately, this issue deals with the bad news that we received in mid-July about a bad fall taken by Arni Bloomquist, brought to our attention by her good friend, Marilyn Pozas. The following is a summary of Arni's condition by her as of late August.



On July 19th I got an email from Dick Blomquist that Arni had fallen while alone in their house the previous Sunday night. Long story short she was operated on the following Tuesday, had her neck fused, and is currently paralyzed from her chest down. Last Friday Arni moved to a rehab facility, Northwoods Lodge, after five weeks in Harborview Hospital. Apparently the show of concern when she left Harborview was remarkable. There was a very large group of concerned staff out there to say goodbye. But on she moved, with the help of her husband and new staff at Northwoods Lodge, and in time she will hopefully adjust to her new routine and surroundings. The place seems to be highly rated, so I trust she is in excellent hands.

She is still paralyzed from the chest down. She has some movement in her arms but her hands are still paralyzed, although she is having little bursts of feeling in them occasionally. She has what sounds like a very high tech wheel chair that she uses to get around in and is still learning on that front as well.

Arni has many good friends that wish her well, along with her incredible husband, Dick. There is a website that vou can log onto and receive all the old news and new updates when Dick posts them. It's caringbridge.org. You log on and create a user ID and password, then do a search for Arni Blomquist and you will be taken to her pages. I hope and pray the future will be good for Arni and that she will continue to get better and gain mobility. I do think that the outpouring of love and support that Arni has received has really amazed her and has added to her recovery in a very positive way.

And as of last night, Dick is beginning to talk about Arni being able to have visitors. On the caring bridge website he gives information to anyone who is interested in visiting her. These cannot be drop in visitors as there is a very small window in the day for short visits.
