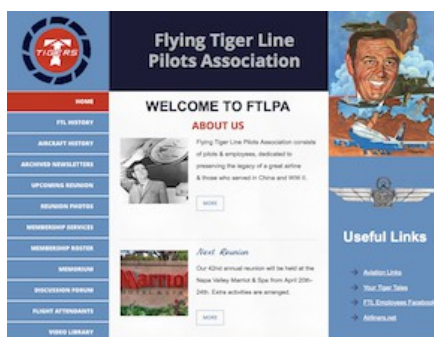

Our **43rd Annual FTLPA Reunion** will be held in 2017 at the Red Lion Hotel-Jantzen Beach from May 17th to May 21st. The hotel is conveniently located off I-5, just 10 minutes north of downtown Portland and 15 minutes from the Portland International Airport. All rooms are identical and include balconies, small refrigerators, microwaves, internet, complimentary business center use, and free parking. Hotel shuttle service to the MAX rail station and other locations within a 4 mile radius will be provided free of charge. Unfortunately the hotel has discontinued their airport shuttle.

Room Reservation Options

Special rates were negotiated for our group but that block has unfortunately been sold out. Attendees currently have three options now available:

1. Contact Red Lion now for the best rate possible rate that you can obtain using Senior, Military, or AAA discounts if possible.
2. Book at the Oxford Suites (immediately next door)
 - Group rates currently secured for \$149 and \$169 per night

Evergreen Air & Space Museum – Friday, May 19th

The Evergreen Aviation & Space Museum is an aviation museum which displays a number of military and civilian aircraft and spacecraft, most notably, the Hughes H-4 Hercules "Spruce Goose".

The bus ride to and from the museum will take approximately 1 ½ hours aboard 56-passenger luxury buses with restroom facilities. Buses will depart the hotel on Friday at 2:30PM and will arrive back at approximately 11PM. Food & beverages are allowed on the busses, but are strictly forbidden from entering the museum.

Important: We have only chartered (3) busses for a maximum capacity of 165 and will be initially limiting our ticket sales to that total. If exceeded we will try to find a solution, but nothing is guaranteed. As of this date we have 95 attendees that have made their payments for the event.

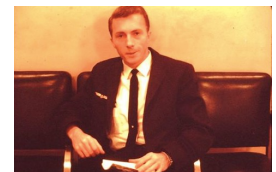

Historic Days

The picture of the Los Angeles Citadel Band shows the forerunner of the Los Angeles Tabernacle, which became the Hollywood Tabernacle and is now the Pasadena Tabernacle Band. The LA Citadel Band is considered to be the first Salvation Army band to fly to an engagement which was on a Flying Tigers DC-3 outfitted for passengers. In World War II it had been used by the military and the seats were parallel along the sides. The LA Citadel Band began the tradition of marching in the Pasadena Tournament of Roses parade in 1920 and that Salvation Army Band has marched longer than any other band.

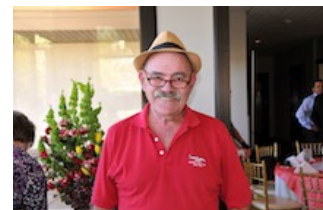

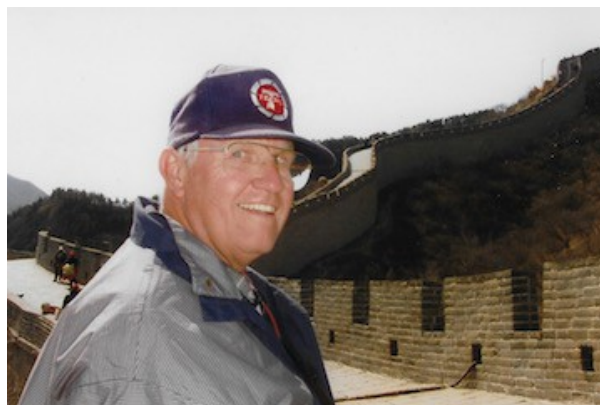
