To honor our military and those wonderful Tiger flight attendants who transported them in times of conflict around the globe all attendees were asked to dress in some type of military attire. A new exhibit, showcasing the Flying Tiger Line was complete and our membership showed their Tiger Spirit by throwing a total of \$1,600 into the donation box by the time the night was done. Honorees on Friday included the following:

Marilyn Breen for her dedication to our brave soldiers who fought, died, and remain missing in Vietnam, and in particular the flight attendants who accompanied them over and returned them in operations referred to as Freedom Bird flights.

Jan Ross Carerre for her years as an FTL stewardess from 1952 to 1954 and her service in transporting troops during the Korean War.

Joe Crecca for his service to our country, specifically his years in captivity as a POW during Vietnam.




On a more solemn note, many took Friday night as an opportunity to visit and say goodbye to their good friend and fellow flight attendant, Becky Day, who unfortunately succumbed to her health issues three weeks later. (see Flown West section below)

**Business Meeting** – Peter Okicich kicked off the meeting this year by introducing his fellow officers and another beautiful rendition of our National Anthem by Georgeanne Seavey followed. There was actually quite a lot of business conducted during this particular meeting as outlined below:

- A moment of silence was observed for those who Flew West since the last reunion and the Life Members who attended this year were recognized. (Marie Rowan, Jo Nell Kocisko, Gloria McComas, Dayna Dehertog, Patti Manley, Carol Beaudu, Carolyn Ristaino, and Kim Mathews)
- A plaque created by Captain Al Lopez to honor the nine flight attendants who have perished in FTL accidents was presented to the membership. Al donated a second plaque to the Palm Springs Air Museum to add to our exhibit, and a third plaque was sent to Carol Gould Hanson, the lone flight attendant survivor aboard FTL 923 that ditched in the Atlantic in 1965. It was then announced to all the FA's in attendance that Al was buying them margaritas after the business meeting! The Tiger's Roar was deafening. Classy move Captain Lopez!
- It was announced that there are still 175 Tigers still flying at FedEx, with Erik Larson the most senior and Bruce Robinson still bringing up the tail of the Tiger as the last pilot hired. Bill Libby, also in the very last class hired came to the reunion for his first time and was introduced.
- Changes to the association bylaws were discussed and then subsequently amended. (see below for more details)
- Frank Maguire gave an excellent presentation to honor the members of the FTL/FDX Merger Committee for their hard work and efforts over 30 years ago.
- Joe Wight, son of Garrett and Maralyse, was nominated and successfully voted in as an Honorary Member of FTLPA.
- President, John Dickson, explained the need for more junior members of FTLPA to step up and consider future officer positions. Scott Mergele was nominated and confirmed to fill the VP position being vacated by Larry Weeks. One of Scott's first initiatives will be an effort to solicit new memberships and more involvement from the more junior contingent of the FTL seniority list. Sharon Sowell and Bill Libby have subsequently offered their assistance.
- Details of the next reunions in Long Beach (2019) and San Antonio (2020) were discussed and a quick poll of those in attendance was made for input into a city for 2021.

- Book projects and sales were promoted by Debra Paul, Reyne O'Shaughnessy, and Leigh-lu Prasse.
- A more comprehensive presentation was made by Guy Van Herbruggen and Charles Kennedy for their next book project titled Flying Tiger Memories (see News section below for more details)
- Our Guest Speaker, Kristine Wood, capped off a very successful meeting with her presentation of the Run For The Wall motorcycle ride that is planned each year. This year represented the 30<sup>th</sup> consecutive year for the ride from Ontario, CA to Washington, DC to honor those KIA and MIA who can not. # Amended Bylaws

By a majority vote by the members attending the business meeting in Palm Springs, our association bylaws were amended as follows:

- Honorary Membership is no long limited to just one nomination per year. However, to be eligible for nomination all prospective Honorary Members must have attended at least three FTLPA reunions within the past five years, the present reunion included.
- A new position was officially created for a Life Member Representative to act as a liaison for those
  members left behind by the loss of their spouses who were Regular Members of FTLPA. Donna
  Mergele, who has been acting in this capacity in the interim, has been confirmed as our new
  representative.
- Attendance at all future FTLPA reunions are limited to members current in their dues or to their guests
  who must be listed on a member's registration form. Any and all guests, whether family members,
  friends, or former FTL employees attending for the first time, are always welcome and encouraged to
  attend but must now be specifically listed on a their host's form.
